Personal Support People

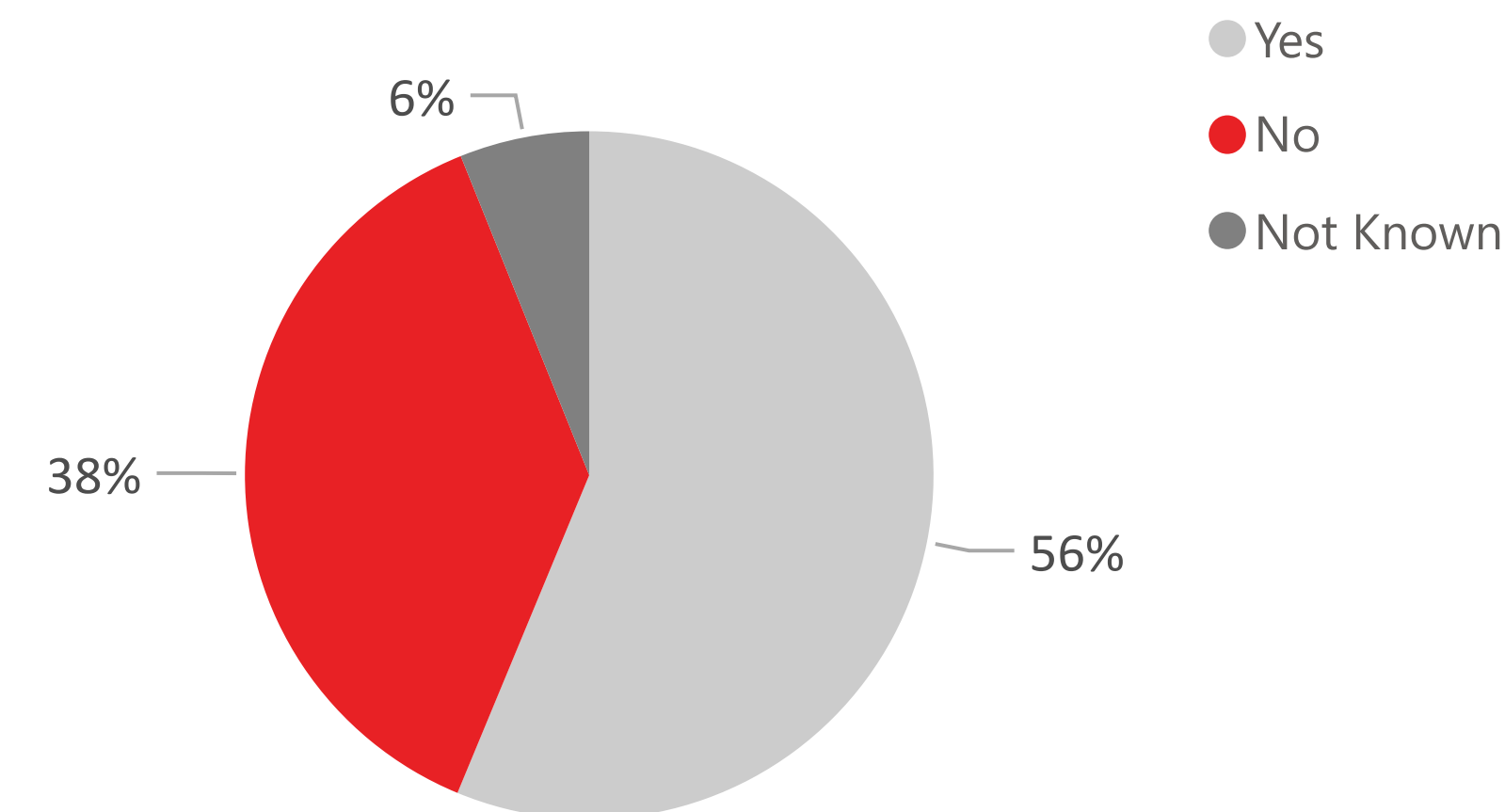
The resident has a carer / family member



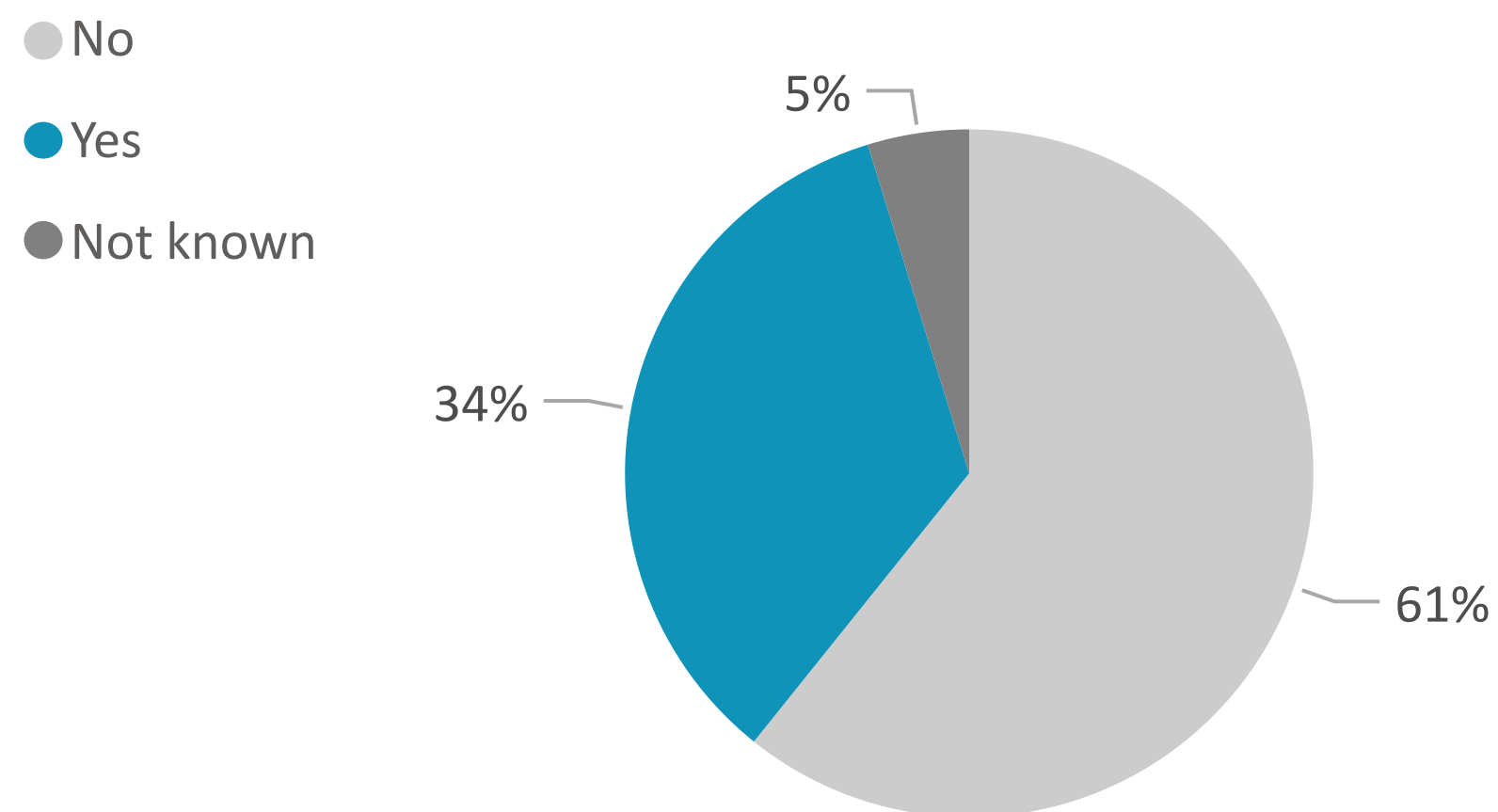
**For some residents,

The resident has a Nominated Person*



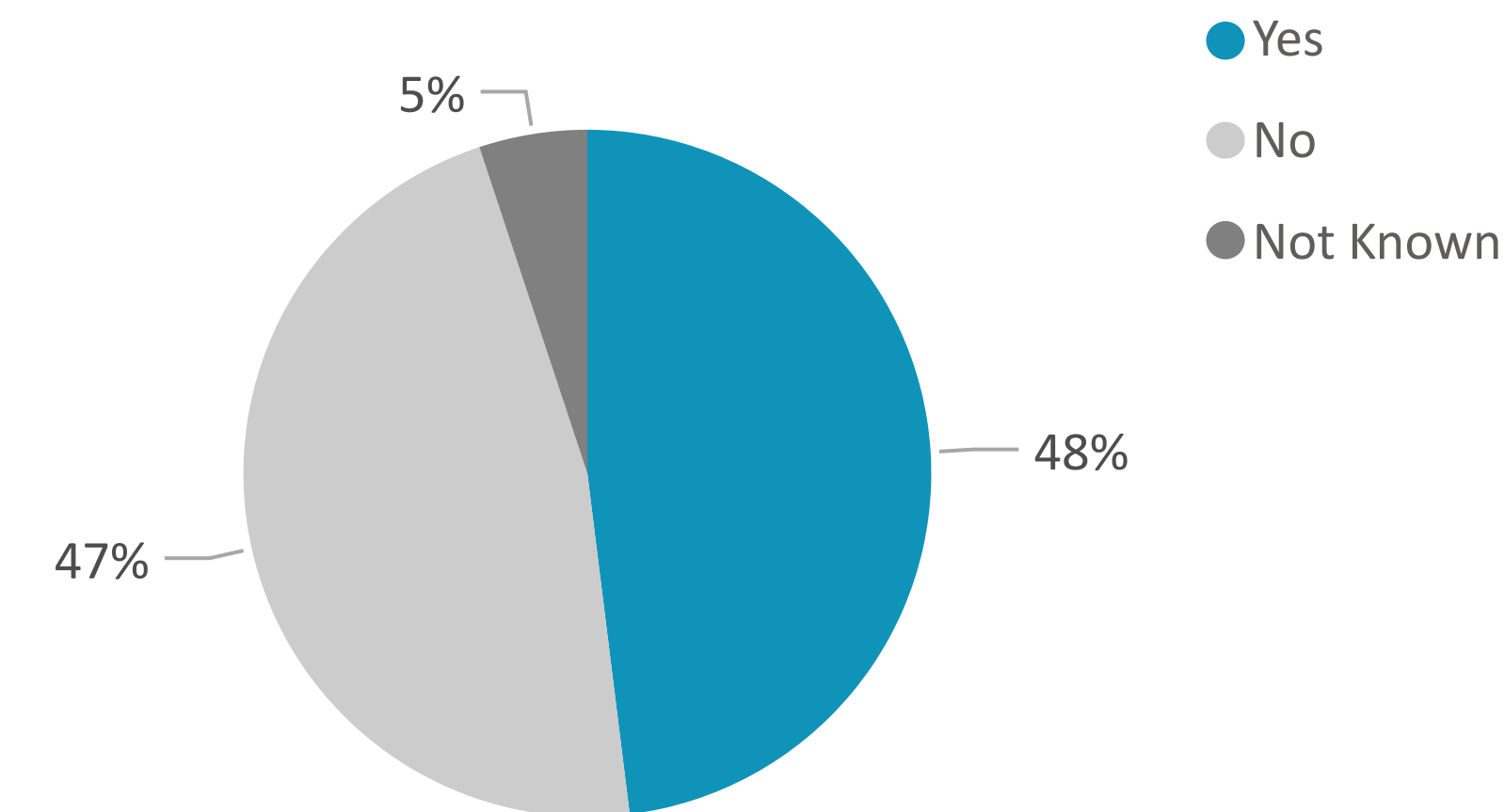
The resident is a minor or has an appointed guardian

The resident has an administrator

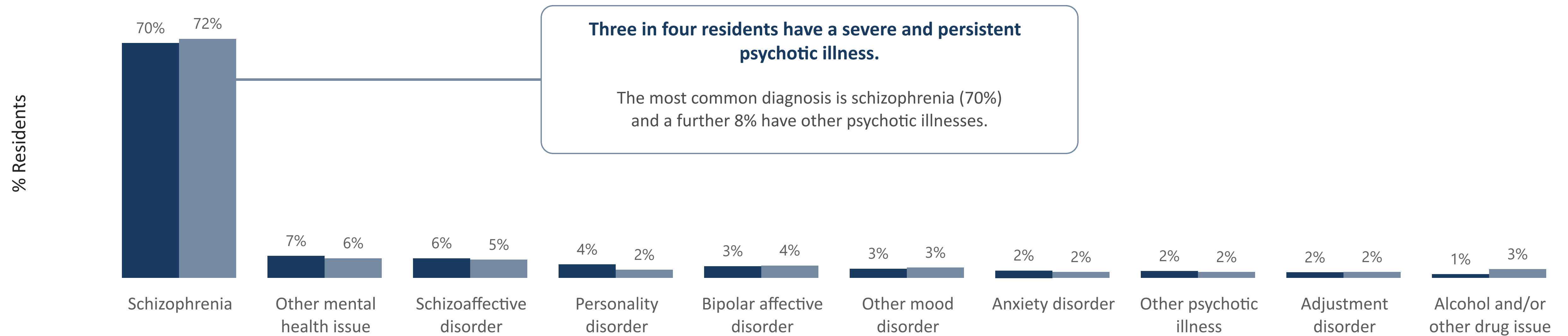

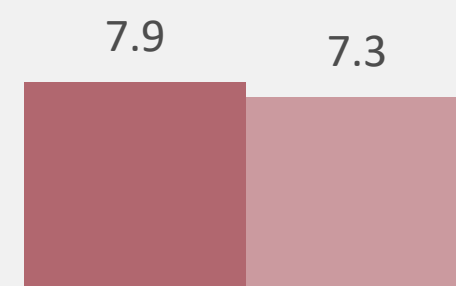

Health of the Nation Outcome Scale (HoNOS)

HoNOS is a measure of how complex a person's needs are. In adult mental health services, it should be routinely assessed every 90 days. Scores can range from 0 - 48. A higher score means more complex needs.

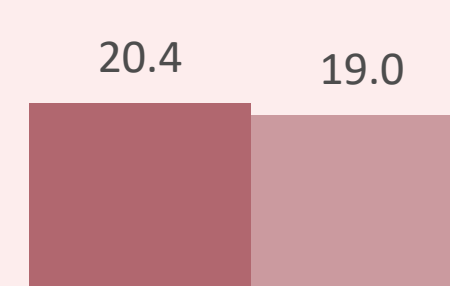

Kessler 10 Plus (K10+)

K10+ is important because it is a consumer-rated measure. It should be routinely collected every 90 days in adult mental health services. Scores can range from 10 - 50; higher scores mean the person reports feeling more distress.

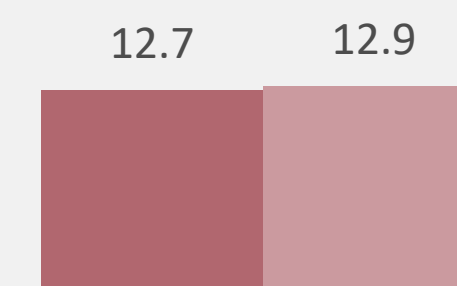

Life Skills Profile (LSP)

LSP is a measure of function, which should be routinely assessed in adult mental health services every 90 days. Scores can range from 0 - 48. A lower score means the person can currently do more independently.

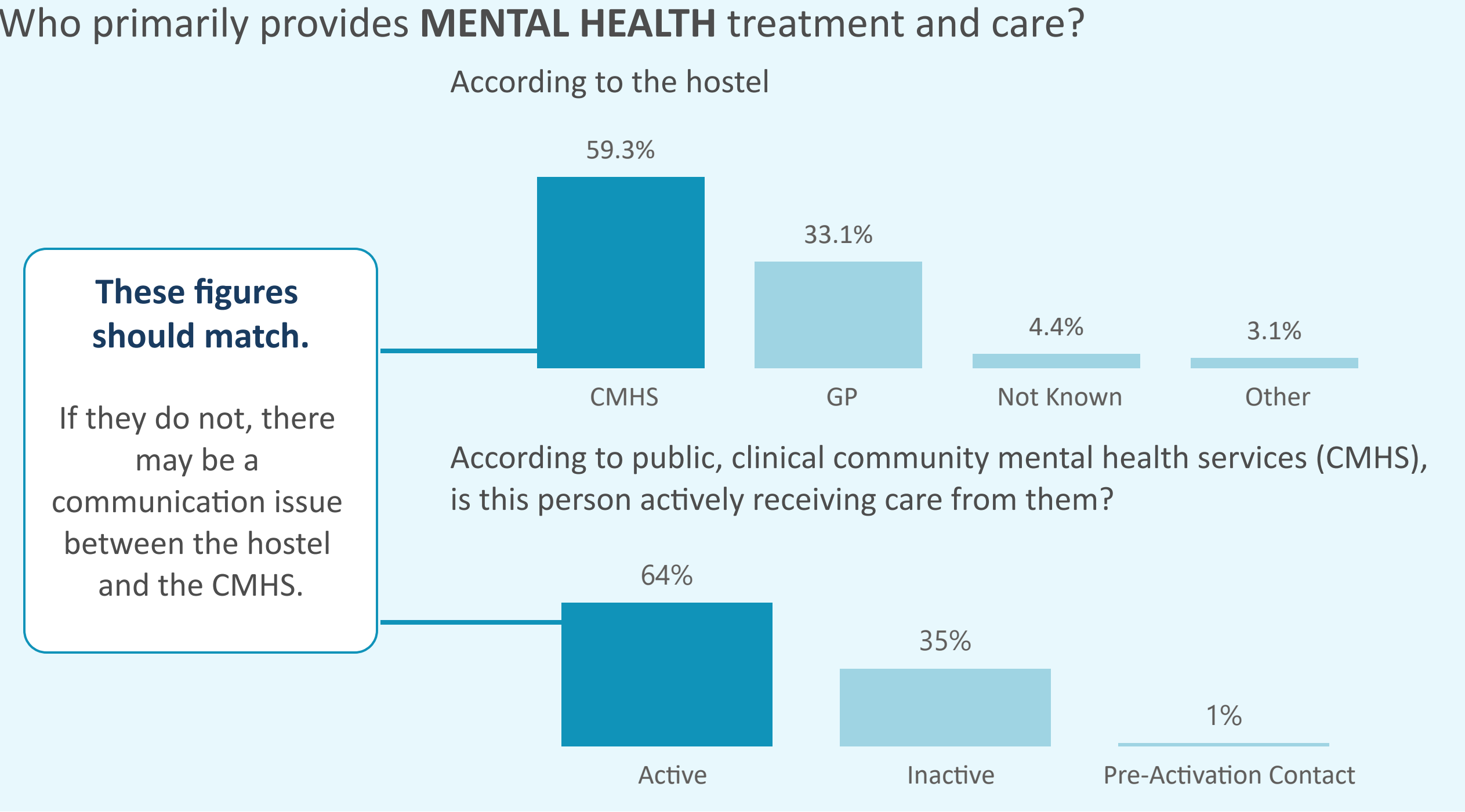

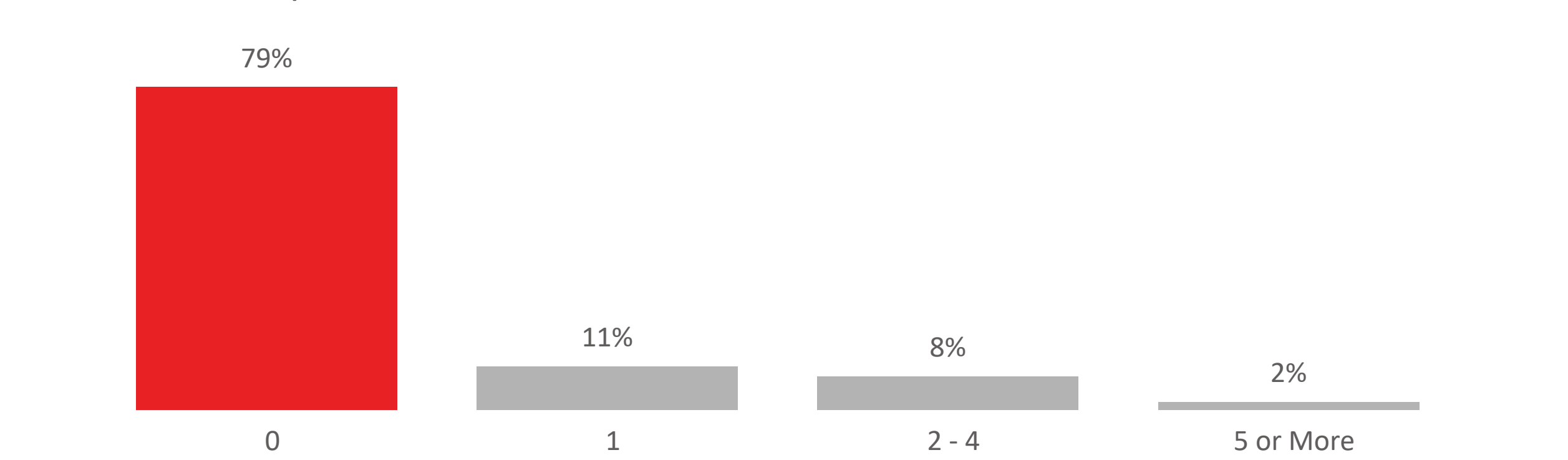

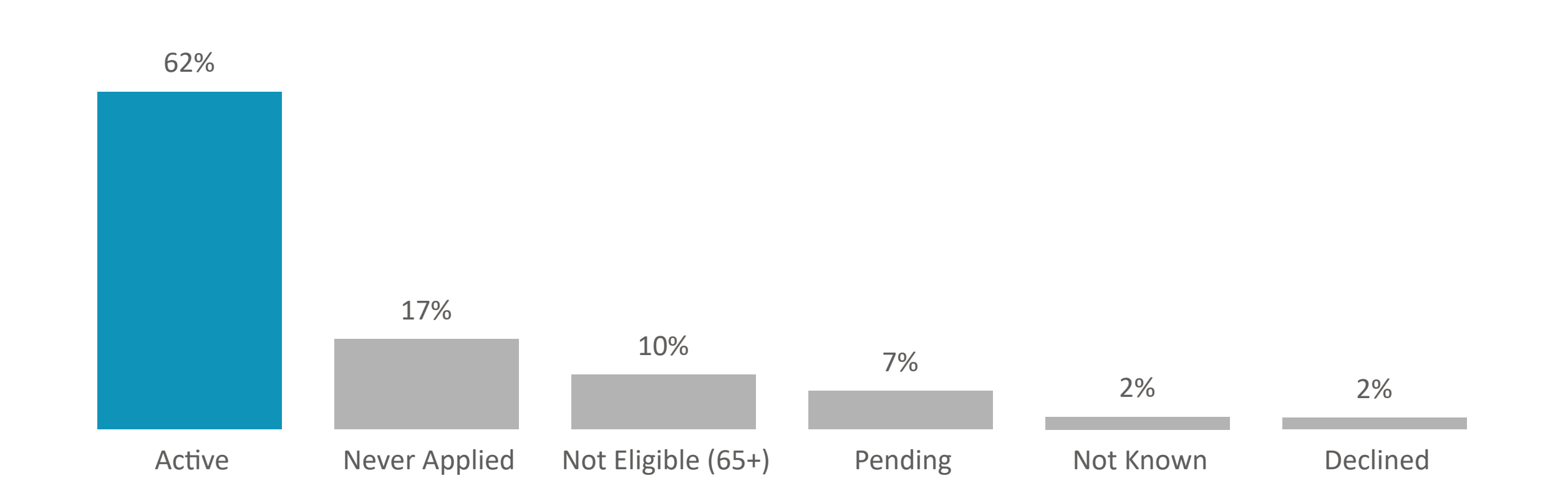

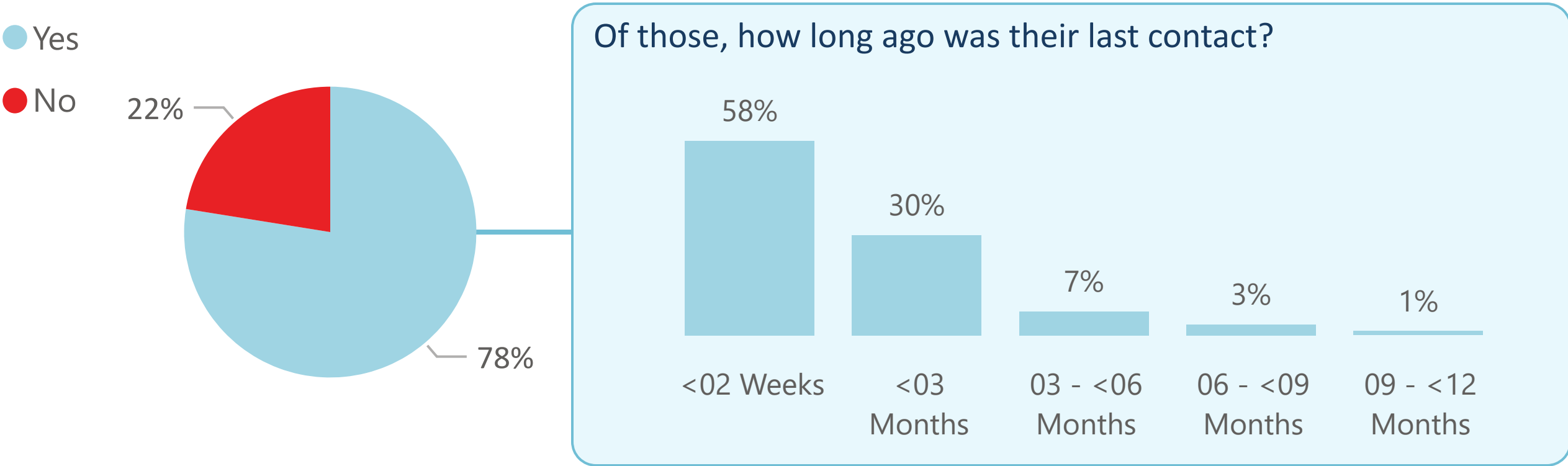
Mental health inpatient admission in the last 12 months

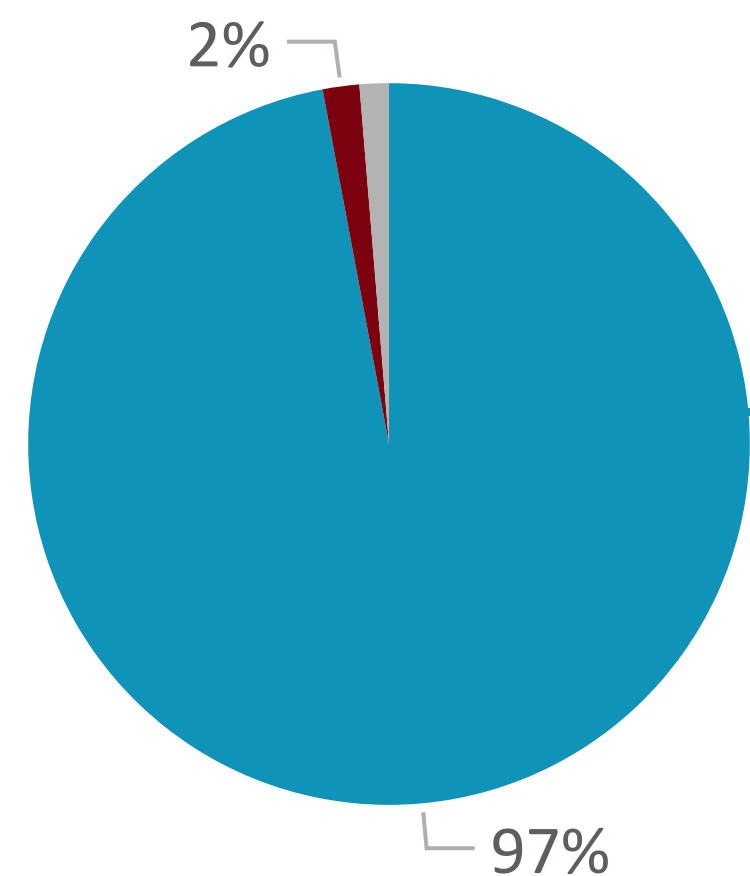

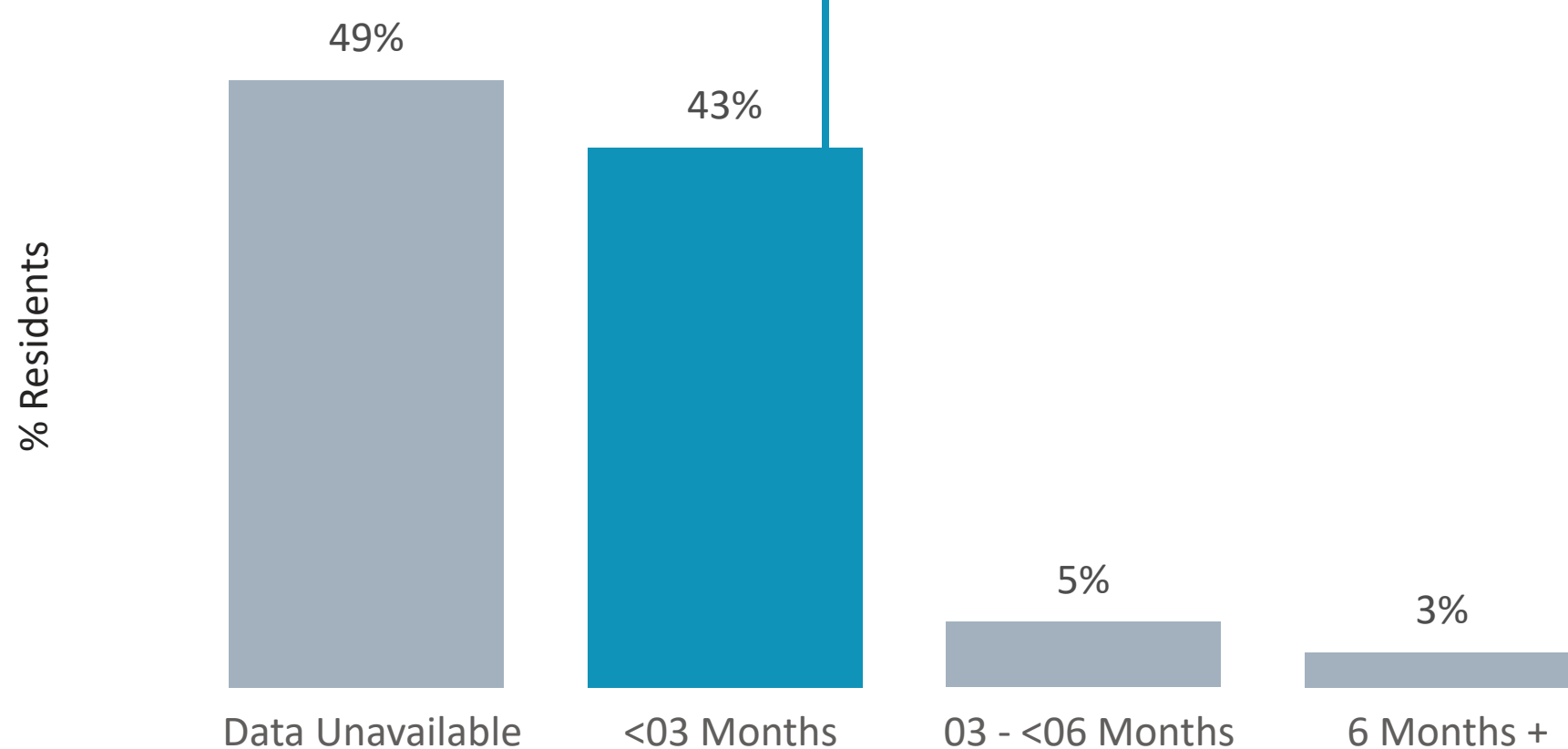

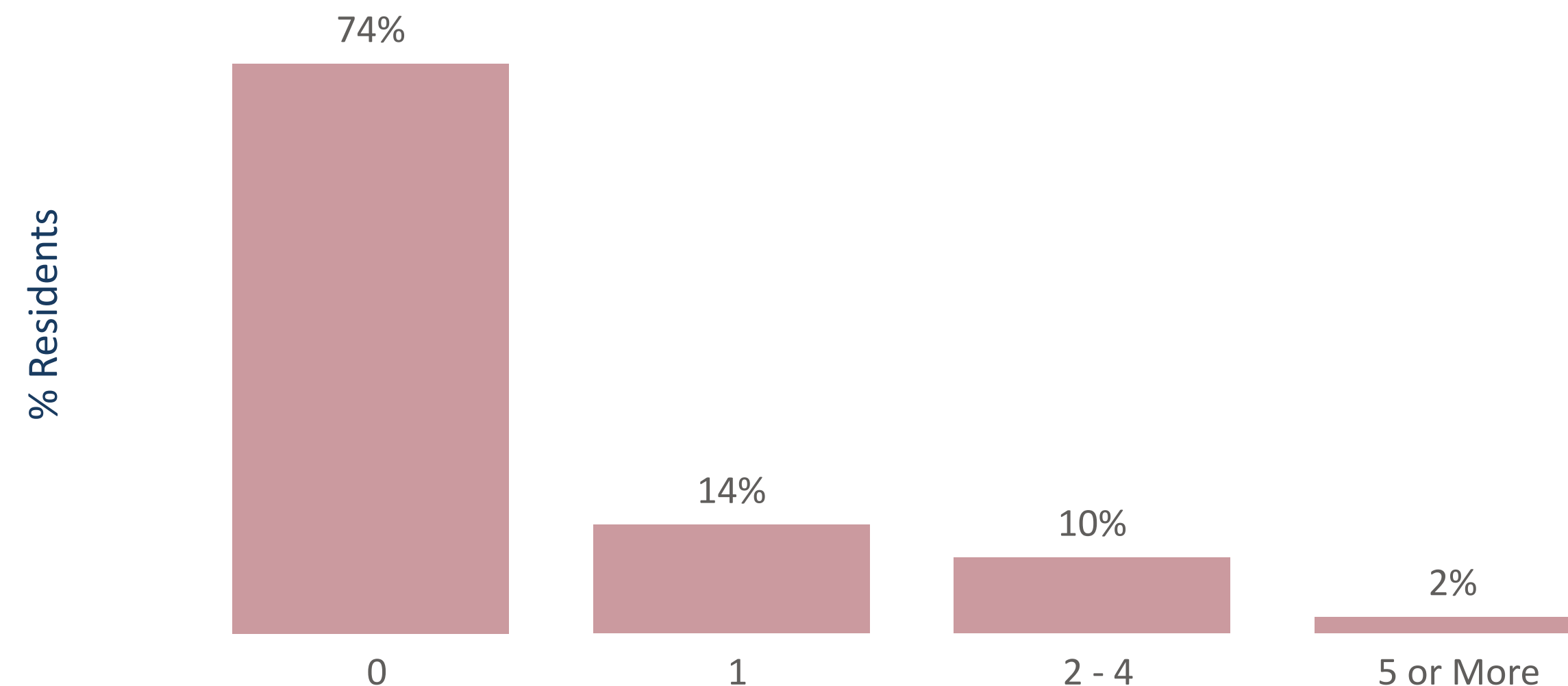

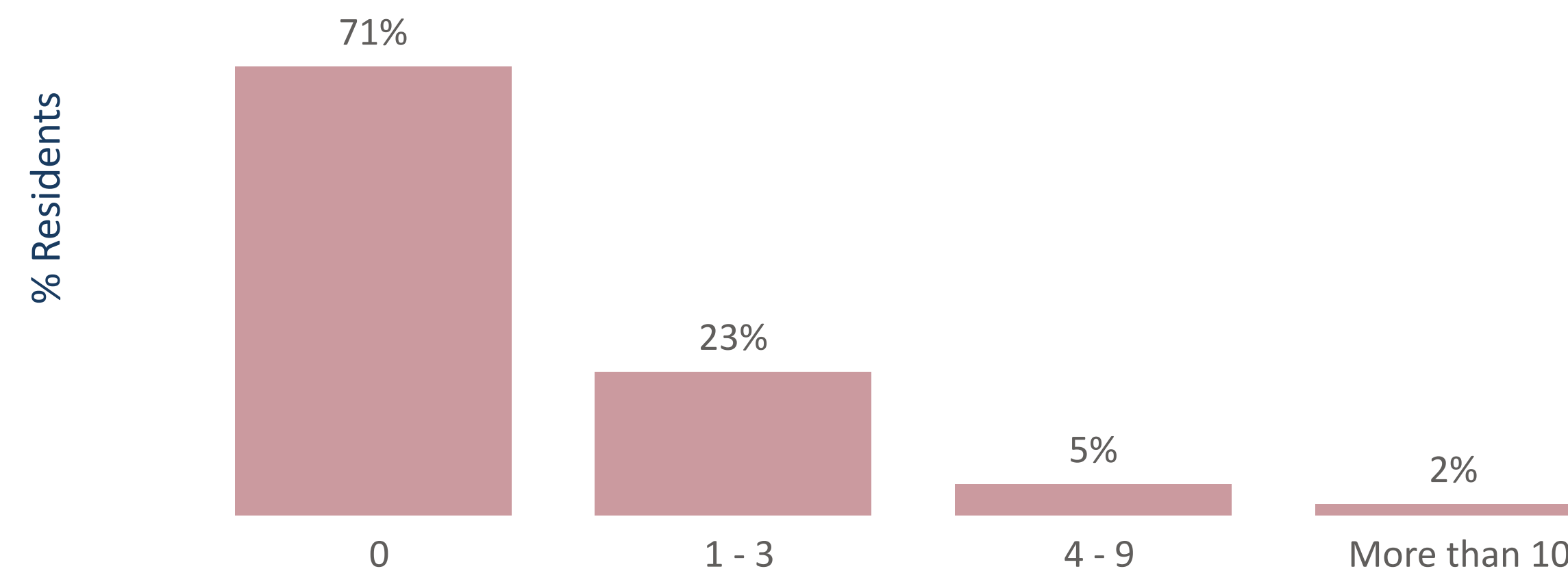

ED Presentations for Physical Health Issues 2021



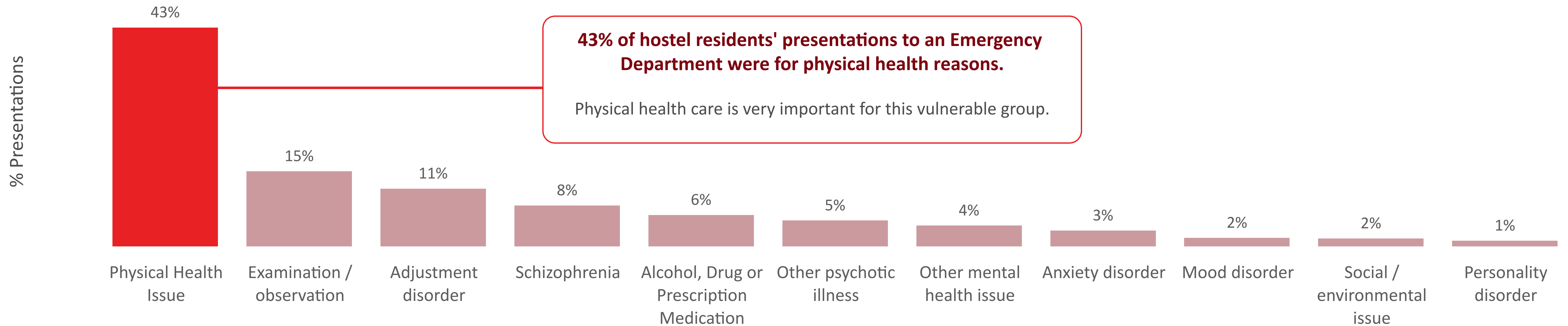

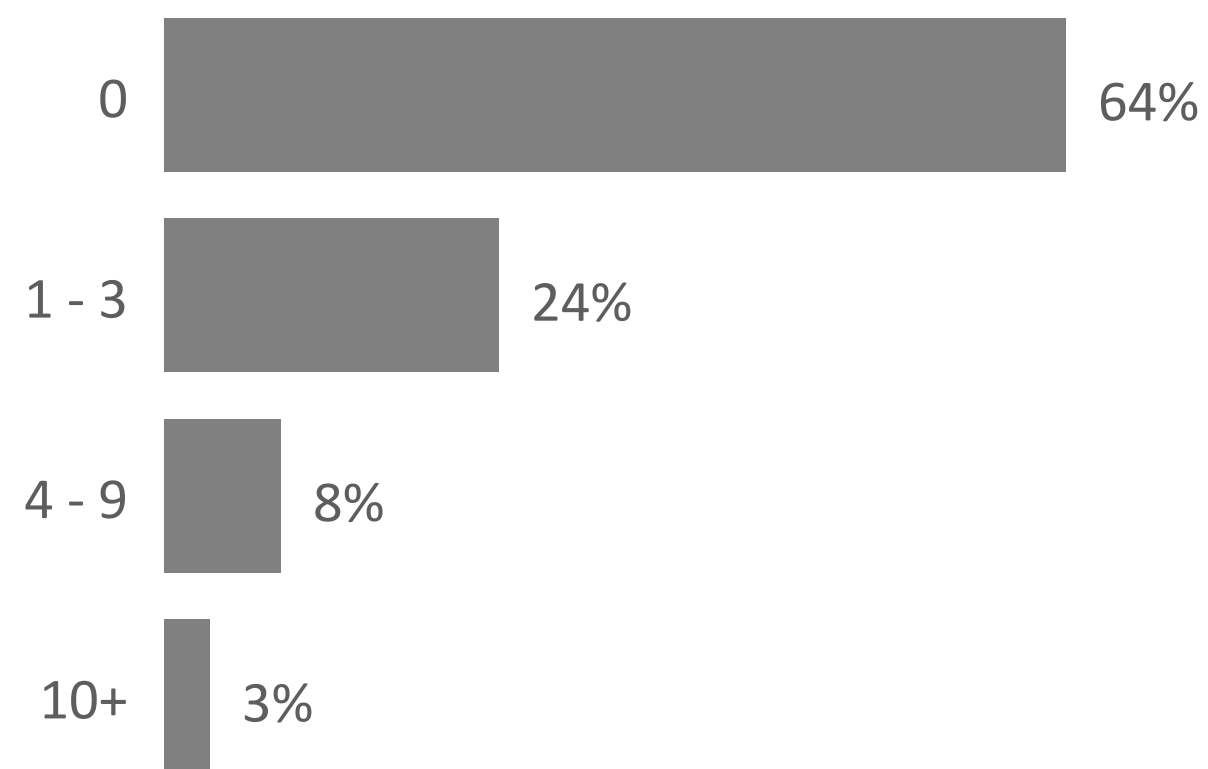

How many times have residents received care in a MHOA* or MHEC* in the last 12 months?

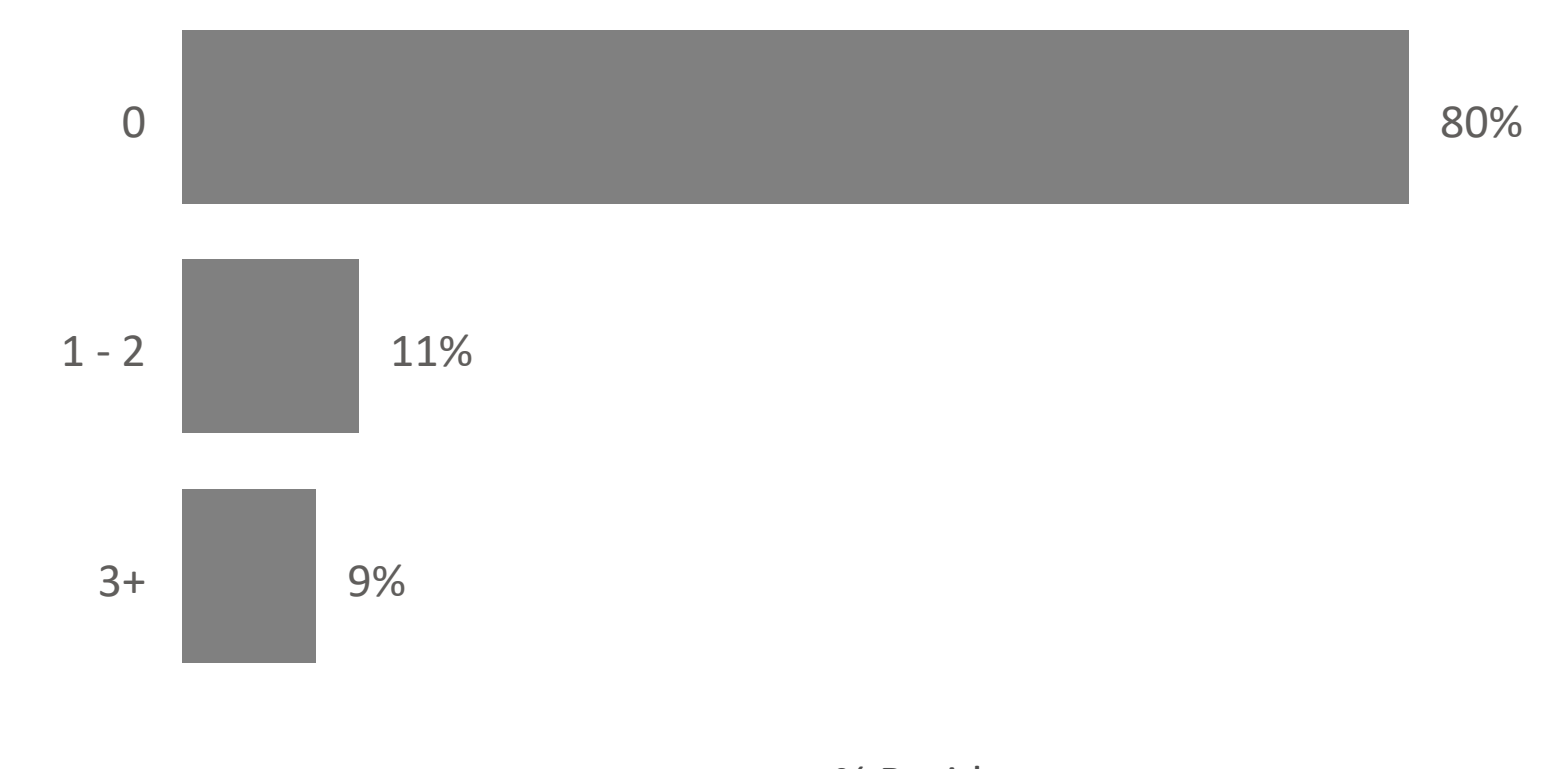
